# Living the Word: Psalm 97

The sovereignty of God, expressed in this Psalm with the words: 'the Lord is king,' is not something we always feel comfortable with, as it implies control and force to our modern-day eyes. If we are prepared to take this Psalm at its face value, the glory, the magnificence, and the splendour of God might even be said to strike us with terror. We can be happier with the domesticated images of God in Jesus Christ as our Friend or as our Teacher. But that runs the danger of distorting what the sovereignty of God and this Psalm mean. The opening verses give us a clue as to what this quality means in practice. Christ is the 'Dominus', the Lord, and therefore he is to be king over every part of our lives. Sovereignty is not defined in terms of worldly power. God is a loving creator: 'let the earth rejoice'. God is Lord of time and space: 'cloud and darkness are his clothing'. He is the God of justice and right. All things are held in his hand. This is marvellous to see, and our response is one of worship. The sovereignty of God is not about terror but exultation. We are called to respond in adoration.

# **Prayers to Remember**

O Life of the dying and Salvation of the sick, the only hope of the wretched, and the resurrections of the dead, who rose on the third day, joyful and free, having broken the bonds of death and hell: I beg you with heartfelt gratitude, Most High God, to grant unto me in my weakness a part in the first resurrection by the remission of my sins, and a share with your saints in the second resurrection which is without end, O Lord Jesus Christ.

# Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> June 2025 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter Gospel: John 17: 20 – end



Today we hear the prayer the Son offers to the Father at the Last Supper. It is known as the High Priestly Prayer. Jesus says, 'I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known'. And so he does. Jesus continues to make known the Father's name through his ministry as the Son, a ministry which he passed on to the Apostles, and from them on to their episcopal successors in every generation. This is the apostolic ministry which Jesus established and through which he continues his own reconciling work among men. This ministry, exercised by bishops, priests, and deacons in the historic succession. assures us of the continuation of Christ's own ministry. In our celebration of the Eucharist, the glory of God is being revealed. This is 'the glory I gave to them', which Jesus refers to in today's Gospel. We receive in word and sacrament the love with which the Father loves the Son, and which he has shared with us in the life of the Holy Spirit. What a great gift!
